The Client

The Australian Public Sector Anti-Corruption Conference 2013 (APSACC) is a joint initiative of Australia's three major anti-corruption agencies: *The Independent Commission Against Corruption (ICAC)*, *The Corruption and Crime Commission (CCC)* and *the Crime and Misconduct Commission (CMC)*.

The Conference was a high profile event within the anti corruption industries across Australia and attracted delegates from within Australia and internationally from 20 countries. The event was widely acclaimed, due mainly to the high calibre of the presenters and speakers and provided delegates with a unique opportunity to focus on the latest trends, strategies and future directions in preventing corruption.

Conference Objectives

The 2013 Conference theme 'Vision.Vigilance.Action' reflected the knowledge, skills and attributes needed to effectively identify, consider and respond to corruption and misconduct. The Australian and international speakers responded to the challenging theme and delivered a program that was both relevant and thought provoking for delegates.

Conference Program

The objectives of the Conference were achieved by ensuring a comprehensive and well planned program was established. The Conference program is presented in a variety of mediums designed to give maximum information exchange. These mediums include;

- 3 Keynote Speakers
- 28 Papers
- Conference Dinner
- 4 Streams over 2 days
- 6 Workshops (held pre-conference)
- Welcome Reception
- Closing Drinks
- 15 Exhibition Booths

The Role of International Conferences and Events (ICE)

The Conference Committee members were professionals from the industry, each representing the 3 host government agencies. These committee members were volunteering their time and expertise and did not have the time, resources or expertise to coordinate such a large event. Therefore ICE was contracted to professionally coordinate all aspects of the 2013 Conference once again (ICE also managed all aspects of the 2011 Conference held in Perth), this included liaising with all service providers, sponsors, exhibitors, speakers and delegates to ensure a successful outcome was achieved.

Rationale/Methodology

The project planning process involved the construction of a detailed critical path to monitor, update and evaluate the event criteria. ICE reported monthly to the Conference Committee.

Key Achievements

There were a number of major achievements, including:

- More than double the projected sponsorship and exhibition income was achieved
- Exceeded projected registration numbers by 26%
- 95% of all attendee registrations were fully paid in advance of the Conference. A great achievement considering a significant amount of overseas registrants, including from Developing Countries, attended.
